j) Vancouver & District Caller/Teachers Ass'n – Brent Mawdsley

The Caller Teachers met on March 16, 2019

The callers were informed that a letter was prepared to look at obtaining permission from the square dance venues to place signage at those locations to help promote and advertise our activity. It was suggested that we start Kennedy and Brookswood halls first.

The fall rounds of the months are Serenade to Spring for October, and I Want To Stroll Over Heaven With You for November.

The new dancer calluses were discussed for the caller attending and they all seemed to be doing good. Chilliwack had about 17 new dancers, Guys 'n' Gals had 6, Abbotsford had about 10 - 12.

The new dancer Jamboree was discussed and an invite to all the local callers and cuers will be sent out. The list was being circulated and it was again stated that it was not a mainstream dance.

It was mentioned that the deadline for registering for the 2019 Festival in Salmon arm was fast approaching and all were encouraged to register.

It was mentioned that the Convention 2020 registration was not as high as hoped and all were encouraged to register sooner than later.

A Cuer's workshop and Roundaree was suggested with a proposed date of September 14 or 21 and Brian Penny was going to verify the date with the featured cuer. (Susan Healy has been contacted for this). The Roundaree would be phase 2 with some phase 3. It is planned to be at the ASAA hall.

Caller's workshop will be at Kennedy Hall on October 25 & 26 prior to the Gary Shoemake dance.

A motion was passed to offer the Corn Cob Caper Dance to the Promotion Committee. The callers would still call and provide the equipment, but the promotion Committee would be responsible for the rest. August 25th was the proposed date.

Up coming dances were mentioned as well.

Condolences were being passed on for Christine Brendzy's father passing away.

It was also mentioned that Ron Booiman's father passed away.

There will be a singles board.

Hi Everyone, I think most of you know me, and today I am representing the Swinging Singles Building Fund as chairperson. I have with me Sylvia French, Swinging Singles treasurer and also Secretary of the FVS&RDA. Eva Matheson is here as Past President of the Swinging Singles and Social Convenor of the FVS&RDA. At one time we had 18 members in the Building Fund committee but due to some people moving away and others passing on are numbers have dwindled. We are still fortunate to have Gladys McManus and Florence Wray as honorary members as well as our hard working Peter Tamilin (who served on the Building Fund as well as the Building Society), along with Roy Swanson, Al Williams, and Shirley Innes. So...on to the story why I am here today.

In 1980 Diana Christensen (Lifton) had an idea that the Swinging Singles should raise money to have their own square dance hall, and we all worked very hard with her to raise enough money to do so. But with the cost of land and buildings soaring, we were unable to complete her and later our dream.

Addendum 1.

Funding For New Dancer Classes

FVS&RDA Funding – Guidelines located on page 36 of Resource Book Section 2

-All funding for this grant is from the De Smit Fund of the FVS&RDA

- Submission of Application Form located on pages 37-38 of Resource Book Section 2

- Clubs should have made an effort to obtain new dancers and form a new dancer class

- Budget information is required, including Hall Rental and Caller Fees, and a projected estimate of

revenue from new dancer fees, and how much the club expects to subsidize the class from their fees.

- Amount of grant will not exceed \$250.00 per dance season

- Applications must be submitted yearly, and reviewed yearly. Submission is no later than Sept. 30, with Exec. Review to be Nov. 30 (fall season) or Mar. 30 (winter/spring season). Submit paperwork by these dates.

- Clubs are to report the number of graduated dancers at the end of season, along with page 38 of Resource Book Section 2, by Sept. 30.

- Some more regulations remain, but the above are the main points. Please read the Guidelines as located above.

Promotion Committee Funding – A short profile located on page 61-62 of Resource Book Section 2 - All funding from this committee is provided by fundraising projects (i.e. 5-year calendar) and special event profits (if any), (i.e. New Dancer Jamboree)

- Any club that has new dancer classes may request for 75%, up to a limit of \$400, of their printed advertising bills (i.e. newspaper ads, flyers, etc.) ONLY. No radio, TV, signs or feathers are eligible.

- Club must provide receipts as to how much was spent, and where.

- Reimbursement is one time per year, paid out in January-February period.

- All requests and receipts are to be received by the Promotion Committee Chairperson or Promotion Treasurer by March 1 of each square dance year (September to May)

- This funding for advertising is separate from the FVS&RDA Grant and the BC Federation Grant, and must be applied for separately.

- Full details on this funding are in the Valley Circle February 2019 issue, page 37.

BC Square & Round Dance Federation Financial Aid for New Dancer Classes

- BC Federation funding is provided by a membership fee obtained from BC clubs and dancers. Full information on this funding is located on page 9 of Resource Book Section 3, with application guidelines and application forms located on pages 22, 23, and 24 of Resource Book Section 3

- All clubs having financial difficulty with hall costs and caller fees may apply to the BC Federation for funding

- Callers and cuers and clogging instructors doing their own classes may also apply.

- The grant is up to a maximum of \$250, and may be made every 2 years, but preference will be given to clubs that have not previously received the grant.

Applications should be sent to the 1st Vice President, to be reviewed by the Funding Committee headed by the 1st Vice President. At this time Dennis Sutton, Region 1, email <u>dsutton9@telus.net</u> is 1st Vice Pres.
Application deadline is March 1 of a current calendar year.

Report on 2018 Promotion Committee ROAR Workshop for FVSRDA Meeting April 7, 2019 by Brent Mawdsley

On October 13, 2018, the Promotion Committee held a half day workshop called "Rebuilding Our Activity and Recreation (ROAR)". About 16 people attended and shared ideas on the topic. Brent Mawdsley presented an overview of the Callerlab Square Dance Marketing Manual and related resources, and a recent promotional success story. These documents and resources were distributed to the attendees after the workshop.

I think the decline in square dancing is evident to all that are involved. In order to re-build it, we are all going to have to work together with coordinated effort, and try new ways of promoting, recruiting, and retaining dancers, because the old ways are not working well enough.

We must think of the square dancing as product we have to sell to the public. We may think it's "the best thing since sliced bread", but market research has shown most of the general public are not aware it exists or have an outdated and/or negative perception of it.

It takes time and persistence to change these views. Fortunately, many groups across BC, Canada, and the USA have been working on these challenges and have been sharing their ideas, plans and resources they have created. We just need to review these ideas and decide which ones to implement in our area and how to do.

The Promotion Committee is the group that can facilitate this for the benefit of all dancers in our region; we just need motivated people to help. Here are some of the key concepts and resources, and the success story we discussed at the ROAR workshop. The internet links to these documents and some additional resources are below.

Three key sales/marketing aspects related to Rebuilding Our Activity and Recreation (ROAR) are Promotion, Recruiting and Retention.

1. Promotion

- a. the delivery of messages that inform, educate and persuade consumers to purchase the product, and the methods used to communicate those messages
- b. raises awareness and tells people why they should square dance
- c. on-going, year-round activities
